

EEB to increase its presence in the Stock Market

- *Empresa de Energía de Bogotá, parent company of Grupo Energía de Bogotá, will boost its presence with the support of Credicorp Capital Colombia S.A., a stockbroker agency, who will be in charge of leading the Market Maker program.*

Bogotá, D.C. 7 December 2015.- Empresa de Energía de Bogotá (EEB), parent company of Grupo Energía de Bogotá, signed a contract with Credicorp Capital Colombia S.A. to implement the Market Maker program intended to provide greater liquidity to EEB share and to make them an attractive instrument for investors by improving and increasing their presence in the local stock market.

The aim of the strategy, among other things is, to increase the liquidity of EEB shares and enable their trading volume; boost its position in Colcap (Colombian index for most liquid shares); enjoy greater presence in the Colombian Securities Exchange (BVC) transaction platforms to attract the attention of national and foreign investors alike, and most importantly, to protect minority shareholders.

“EEB is a sound and regulated company with a diversified equity portfolio, not only in Colombia, but also in Brazil, Peru and Guatemala. By means of market maker program we would be giving greater daily liquidity to the share.” Remarked Mr. Ricardo Roa Barragán, EEB’s CEO.

Upon the authorization granted by the Finance and Public Credit Ministry, by means of notification issued on 29 September 2015, EEB became the fourth company in the country to be part of the market maker program. To date, the following companies make use of this instrument, namely: the Exchange Trade Fund (ETF) ICOLCAP, Bolsa de Valores de Colombia and ETB.

From December 7, 2015, EEB’s share grew by 3,8%. It is worth highlighting that the market maker program will be funded by Credicorp Capital.

Next Monday, on 14 December 2015, EEB’s CEO will open the trading session, to be held at Colombian Securities Exchange, announcing the initiation of the market maker program for EEB’s share.

About Grupo Energía de Bogotá

Grupo Energía de Bogotá is the leading corporation in the Colombian power sector. Through EEB it transports electricity to the most significant markets in terms of demand and size in the country and participates in the distribution of electricity. It controls nine affiliate companies and directly performs the activity of electricity transportation in Colombia, in a market with the highest demand in the country. In the electricity chain in Colombia, it participates in the distribution of electricity via Empresa de Energía de Cundinamarca – EEC. In addition, it controls the largest natural gas carrier in Colombia, TGI S.A with a stake of 47.6% within the market, including an extension of 3,957 Kms. in gas pipelines services highly populated areas in Colombia such as Bogotá, Medellín, Bucaramanga, the Coffee Region and the Llanos Foothills. In Peru, its company CONTUGAS has a 30-year concession for the transportation and distribution of natural gas in the Ica Department, likewise with its company CALIDDA, it distributes natural gas in the regions of Lima and Callao. In that same country, together with ISA, it holds stocks in REP S.A. and TRANSMANTARO S.A., which operate 63% of the electricity transmission system in Peru. In 2010, it established TRECSA - Transportadora de Centroamérica S.A.- in charge of building the most

important infrastructure Project in Guatemala and will render electricity transmission services as of 2014. Furthermore, GEB holds an investment portfolio in important companies in the electric power sector, in which the following stand out, CODENSA S.A., EMGESA S.A., GAS NATURAL S.A., PROMIGAS S.A. and Electricadora del Meta - EMSA and to a lesser extent ISA and ISAGEN. As of 2013, the Group renders advisory and engineering services in Guatemala and Peru through its affiliate EEB Ingeniería y Servicios. Also, in 2014 it created the company Empresa de Movilidad de Bogotá SAS E.S.P., affiliate company dedicated exclusively to developing electric power mobility projects. In August 2015, EEB completed the acquisition of 51% of four electric power transmission companies in Brazil, namely: Transenergía Renovavel S.A., Transenergía Sao Paulo S.A., Goias Transmissao S.A., y MGE Transmissao S.A



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
